Leigh has been married to Scott for 24 years and is the mother of three sons. In her spare time, she likes to travel with her family to sporting events and amusement parks.




Leigh Riley Evans


Fred D. Page Sr.

Fred D. Page Sr., is a WWII Navy veteran that served in the US Navy from September 1943-1946. He was born in Bainbridge, Georgia on June 24, 1925 and grew up in Winnfield, Louisiana. His mother died when he was two years old and he was raised by his WWI-minister-tailor father Rev. Phillip Peterson Page. Fred took an interest in art and began drawing and painting and at a very young age. His artwork was recognized by a local pastor and he was recruited to draw a picture of an elaborate mansion in Louisiana. The mansion belonged to T.L. James, a highly regarded industrialists and businessman in the south. The drawing of the home was so intricate, the pastor that requested the drawing, asked him to draw a picture of his church. His meticulous attention to detail with both drawings prompted the

church's congregation to collect funds to compensate Fred for his work. Fred decided to use the money to travel to Indianapolis and reunite with his mother's side of the family and pursue his dreams to study artistry. After moving to Indianapolis as a teenager to be with his maternal aunt, he was drafted in the military as a student from Crispus Attucks High School. Fred was part of the invasion of France but remembers the Mediterranean Sea and seeing Mount Vesuvius. He saw sights he never would have seen in his life. He became a cook and a petty officer. Fred ended up on a minesweeper, the USS Effective AM92 that was reclassified as the US Sub Chaser PC 1596 with officers James McKay, King, and "an old Salt that really knew what he was doing" when traveling through the Bermuda Triangle. With the danger of their mission, they were blessed to survive 'The Perfect Storm' when many sister ships were lost at sea. They were in route through the Panama Canal to be part of the invasion of Japan when President Truman dropped the atomic bomb before they got there. Their ship redirected and went to California. Instead, of re-enlisting in the military, Fred became a civilian again. By being a veteran with benefits, he later enrolled in the nation's first self-help program to build a Flanner House Home close to the downtown Indy area for his young family in 1956. This program allowed African American veterans to obtain the American Dream. A \$300 'good faith deposit' was required from every family. The men had to be in great physical condition, have good credit standing, make a minimum income of \$3,800 annually, and work a minimum of 20 hours a week on their homes using sweat equity. Upon completion of Fred's home, the Page family was featured on the marketing pamphlets for the Flanner House Homes. The Flanner House Homes were recognized as a historic landmark on the National Register of Historic Places in 2003. Landmark recognition for historical neighborhoods was set at an age of 50 years or more to be eligible for consideration, however, a 2004 Indianapolis Star article mentioned Landmark officials lowered the neighborhood age requirement due to the intact condition of the area.

Fred later worked for the Post Office until he retired. He was displayed in the 2015 Indiana State Museum Exhibition of Heroes from the Heartland and had the privilege of participating in the Honors Flight in April 2016. He still lives in the home he worked so hard to build and raise his family in 63 years later. He enjoys spending time with his family, continuing to instill the importance of homeownership to others, and observing the advancing changes within the community he helped to build. Fred D. Page Sr., is now 93 years old.
